The Annual Congregational Meeting for Mount Royal United Church for the year 2018 was held in the form of a worship service and brown bag luncheon on February 10, 2019. There were 46 persons in attendance. The meeting was called to order at 10:30am.

Call to Order of Annual Meeting

Today, in this service we will visibly combine the work and worship of this Church. Jim Morris called the Annual Meeting to Order.

Nomination of Chairperson and Secretary for Meeting

Joe Robinson nominated Jim Morris as Chair for the Annual Meeting, seconded by Ron Roper.

Motion Carried

Jennifer Aikman-Smith nominated Tracy Parrott as Secretary for the Annual Meeting. The nomination was seconded by Joyce Bremner.

Motion Carried

Opening Hymn, Call to Worship, Opening Prayer, the Lord's Prayer

Motion to extend vote to adherents (Section B.3.7.2, page 60, 2019 United Church Manual)

Susan Fowler moved that, as stated in B.3.7.2, on page 60 of the UCC Manual, the "*Adherents may vote at meetings of the congregation if (a) the full members decide to allow adherents to vote; and (b) the vote is on a financial or administrative matter."* The motion was seconded by Nick Smith.

Ron Roper moved that the minutes from the February 11, 2018 meeting be adopted as circulated. Joyce Bremner seconded the motion.

Discussion of Reports, New Business

Presentation and adoption of Annual Reports

A motion to adopt all the annual reports with noted amendments was made by Ron Roper and seconded by David Close. It was noted that on page 24 of the Choir report Jack Patriquin should have been noted to have passed away and that the choir sang a beautiful anthem at his funeral and on page 17 of the Pastoral Care report Joyce Parsons has resigned from the committee rather than is taking a period of absence.

Motion Carried

Presentation and adoption of Financial Reports

David Close presented the Financial Report. Total revenue for the year was \$265,135. Of this amount \$15,000 was from the Estate of Helen Gibson and \$17,332 was transferred from the Memorial Fund for washroom renovations and stained-glass windows. Total expenses for the year were \$257,829 for a net current year surplus of \$7,306. This was added to the surplus from prior years for an accumulated surplus of \$23,459. Envelope givings were up by \$9,103 over last year and M&S offerings were down by \$2,818. We received a recovery of disability insurance of \$12,113 during Rev Daley's leave of absence which has reduced salary expense for the year.

The manse fund investments were discussed. David Close reported that it is presently invested in the CIBC Monthly Income Fund. It was agreed that the Finance Committee review this investment to ensure that it is a "green" investment, both ethically and environmentally friendly.

David Close made the motion to approve the Financial Reports for 2018, listed on pages 39-42 of the Annual Report, as presented. The motion was seconded by Ron Roper.

Motion Carried

David Close presented the 2019 Budget. Envelope givings are budgeted at \$156,000 with total revenue and expenses of \$239,000 for a breakeven budget. Salary increases are budgeted at 1.6% increase over the 2018 year as recommended by the United Church.

David Close moved that the 2019 Budget be approved as presented on page 43 of the Annual Report. The motion was seconded by Joe Robinson.

Motion Carried

New Business

Susan Fowler read the Code of Conduct for staff and volunteers of the church. The intent, when it was created in 2011, was to read and reconfirm our commitment to it each year. All staff and volunteers dealing with vulnerable populations (children, youth, and the elderly) will be required to get a police check done every 3 years. It is the commitment of the church to provide a safe environment for all persons.

Susan Fowler moved that the congregation agree to support the code of conduct and its enforcement. The motion was seconded by Kim Gallant.

Motion Carried

Jim Morris thanked all who contribute to the work of the church.

Jim Morris was thanked for his dedication and commitment to our congregation and received a standing ovation in response to this.

Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned at 12:35pm.

Introduction and Presentation of Profile

Co-chairs Caroline Gingles and Valerie Tremble were delighted to present the profile. Valerie stated that the profile preparation is really the task of telling people who we are, what we do, what we're good at, where we want to go and how we want to be guided. The committee developed the questionnaire to allow the congregation to be able to provide their input. 77 responses were received providing very thoughtful and sometimes surprising answers. The wishes of the majority of the congregation are reflected in the Community of Faith profile. The committee included Caroline Gingles, Valerie Tremble (co-chairs), Marlene MacLeod (secretary), Nancy Brown, Jane Donovan, Susan Fowler, Faye Germon, Karyn Hebert, Esther Mah, Don Matheson, Stephanie Stoneleigh, Lynne Townsend, Stephen Townsend. Our regional liaison was Rev. Charlotte Youland.

The motion to approve the Community of Faith profile content and forward it to Region 14 for their approval was made by Valerie Tremble and seconded by Karen Hudson.

The next steps in the community of faith profile process are to have it approved by the Region, and finally posted on ChurchHub.

The Search Committee was meeting with Rev. Charlotte Youland at 12 noon following the profile meeting to start the process of preparing for the interview process.

Ron Roper moved to adjourn the meeting at 11:45am.

Minutes Mount Royal United Church Community of Faith Search Committee Report November 17, 2019

Ron Roper, past chair of council, welcomed everyone and called the meeting to order at 11:30am. Rev. Charlotte Youland, our Region 14 liaison, was asked to lead the congregation in an opening prayer.

Ron Roper introduced our Region 14 Liaison, Rev. Charlotte Youland and the search committee members: Deborah Maund, Chair, Howard Easton, Erik Gingles, Sarah Gingles, Robert Pickett, Doreen Lane, Jean Lawlor, Jill MacArthur-Guy and Ilene Maund. The members were asked to stand as their names were called.

Ron Roper asked if Tracy Parrott would be willing to act as recording Secretary which she agreed to.

Motion to permit Adherents to vote:

As a result of changes to the United Church organizational structure effective January 1, 2019, adherents are now permitted to vote on a change in pastoral relationships. Pastoral Relations: Community of Faith Reference: "Full members in the community of faith are eligible to vote on pastoral relations matters, including calls and appointments, and may extend voting privileges to adherents of the community of faith." United Church Manual Reference: B.3.7.2 – "Adherents may vote at meetings of the congregation if the full members decide to allow adherents to vote."

Jill MacArthur-Guy made a motion to allow adherents to vote. Charlie Munroe seconded the motion.

Overview of Process

Debbie Maund stated that the Search Committee members were appointed at the Community of Faith meeting on April 28, 2019. Detailed training on the Search process was then provided by the Region 14 liaison, Rev. Charlotte Youland. The vacancy was then posted on Church Hub on June 25, 2019. There were three steps to the interview process: first was a Skype interview, second was for the candidates to provide a 5-7 minute mini sermon and third was a face to face interview. The references for the preferred candidate were checked. There was a second interview with the preferred candidate.

The Candidate

The name of the preferred candidate is the Rev Capt Scott Stuart. He has worked in rural and urban settings. He has worked with all ages. He has served in a military context in the reserve forces as a Captain in the Canadian military. He has training in conflict resolution and pastoral care experience. He likes to work as part of a team.

The terms of his employment will be a salary of \$53,830 (the standard for his level of education and years of experience) with reimbursements for cell phone, travel, continuing education, provisions for study leaves and annual vacations.

The mandatory documentation for his police record check, racial justice training and boundaries training have all been confirmed as being current.

Debbie Maund moved that the Community of Faith receive the name of Rev Capt Scott Stuart to be called by Mount Royal Pastoral Charge effective <u>January 13, 2020</u> with the Terms of Employment consistent the United Church of Canada Minimum Salaries & Reimbursements for Ministry Personnel (2020) and with the position description delineated in the Community of Faith Profile. The motion was seconded by Jill MacArthur-Guy.

Motion Carried.

Rev Charlotte Youland gave a closing prayer and Esther Mah moved that the search committee be dismissed with thanks. Joe Robinson seconded the motion.

Chair of Council Report 2019

2019 Property Maintenance Committee

This committee oversees maintenance of the church property including the adjoining parking lots. Requests for maintenance generally come from periodic inspections of the building and grounds as well as requests through the church office. The committee oversees summer and winter maintenance contracts which consist mainly of lawn care and snow and ice control.

This year, Repairs Plus Property Services (Peter Wilson) conducted the summer and winter contract maintenance. They did a good job keeping the grounds safe and looking nice and have been responsive to any committee requests. Repairs Plus has been retained for 2020. Thanks to the efforts of many, the building and grounds are well maintained and in relatively good condition.

2019 was a very busy year for property maintenance with several projects completed totaling close to \$50,000 in improvements.

In Winter, 2019 the kitchen received a much-needed facelift with new countertops, paint and hardware. A big thank you to the UCW for their patience and assistance during this upgrade.

During August 2019, the second phase of the bell tower masonry work was completed. The work included brick replacement, mortar re-pointing and cleaning and sealing of the entire brick structure.

In October 2019, the church office, minister's study and the Mount Royal entrance hallways were repainted including new window blinds, etc. Thank you to Marlene McLeod and Susan Fowler for their assistance with this project.

In November 2019, church council approved a technology and sound system upgrade. This project includes replacement of office computers and a new sound booth at the back of the sanctuary that will permit better control of the audio/visual equipment.

The maintenance committee and church council would like to acknowledge several generous bequests and donations from individuals and groups that allowed these projects to proceed. The UCW, craft group, art club and bridge groups continue to provide on-going support.

I would like to thank committee members Harold Robinson, Charles Munroe, Randy Scott and John Brown for their continued involvement with the maintenance committee as well as Wayne Surrette for his efforts to keep the church as clean as possible.



1st Jones Lake Scouting has boys and girls ages 5-17 years in our Scouting group. The merger of the two groups has proven beneficial and we have experienced steady growth. We currently offer programming for 47 youth with 20 volunteers.

Beavers (5-7 yrs) and Cubs (8-10 yrs) meet weekly in the church basement on Mondays and Tuesdays respectively. However, they are often away from the church on adventures within the community. Scouts (11-13 yrs) and Venturers (14-17 yrs) meet at the Lion's Den in Centennial Park but most of their meetings are held entirely outside. Our group committee meets once a month on Sunday evenings.

Mount Royal is very supportive of scouting and it is our pleasure to be able to participate as a group in the Remembrance Day service. As well, we appreciate the recognition we get during the Scout/Guide Sunday in February. Through permitting us to store our equipment shed behind the church, ours groups have easier access to our gear, and we have maintained low costs for our group. 1st Jones Lake delivers the Scouts Canada Canadian Path program that encourages youth led planning, doing and reviewing of all our activities. In addition, there are quarterly reviews of the activities to ensure the program is meeting the expectations of the youth.
